# 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time – September 8, 2024

Continuing our journey through the Gospel of Mark, we experience Jesus' healing miracles - people being cured, people being brought back to wholeness in Jesus' presence. Jesus did not perform these healings and miracles to be sensationalized but rather that people might grasp more and more of the need for relationship with God. We have to keep in the forefront of our minds and hearts the covenant that God the Father ratified in Jesus Christ. God sent His Son that we might come to know and live in the experience of the Love of God and that we might become His children once again. As we enter more into the month of September, we return to some routines. Routines can be good as they put some structure to our lives and help us accomplish things we need to accomplish. Routines can also be very empty and mindless if there is not a particular focus or goal in mind. Routines can be meaningless also if we as Christians don't incorporate God and His Love for us. It is very easy to busy our schedule with many things from work to leisure .... We must also remember that we need to prioritize before all else our relationship with God. We have to **intentionally** make time for God through our every day and not relegate just to the hour on Sunday. If making time for God is not given a significant place in our everyday, and we choose only to give whatever time we might have left to God at the end of the day – then how serious and how much of a priority have we given to God who loves us, redeems and saves us? There are many times throughout our week where the Church is making available quiet time before the Blessed Sacrament, daily Mass, and as a Parish we should be seeking to offer more times to pray and to grow in this beautiful faith of ours. All of these moments are happening in your Church for your benefit – use them well.

## **Eucharistic Congress 2024:** Communion to Heal the World Matthew: 23.8

Only 38 days away!

The Congress logo is circular with a Host and Cup at its centre; the Eucharist/Christ is central to our lives. The five ways that that the Eucharist heals surround the central image in five sections with simple images to symbolize each of the themes.

- RESTORE: It restores our relationship with God (symbolized by a Cross reminding us of Christ's crucifixion and resurrection that reconciled us with the Father).
- UNITE: It strengthens the unity of the Church (symbolized by hands coming together to unite ourselves in Christ's love and shared mission).
- 3. INSPIRE: It calls us to worship (symbolized by the bible/scripture recalling for us the Liturgy of the Word that leads us to the Table).
- 4. SERVE: It commits us to serve the poor and marginalized (symbolized by a hand holding a heart reminding us to witness Christ's love in our service to others).
- EQUIP: It empowers us for mission (symbolized by the dove; the Holy Spirit who pours out the gifts needed to carry out the mission Christ entrusted to us).

Eucharistic Congress Choir — You are invited to participate in the Eucharistic Congress Choir! The Congress Choir will support the seven Congress liturgies spanning October 18 - 20. The Congress Choir will include a Schola Cantorum and a Massed Choir. The Schola Cantorum will be responsible for learning all of the music, including harder plainchants and choral works. The Massed Choir will learn a bit less music and is designed to be more broadly accessible to facilitate participation and inclusion. Rehearsals for the Massed Choir will take place in three different locations to make it easier for those in various regions of the Archdiocese to participate.

The Choir's Principal Conductor will be Mr. Michael Gnemmi. Michael is organist at St. John the Evangelist Church in Windsor, NS (part of Corpus Christi Parish). Michael has sung with the Archdiocesan Choir many times and is currently President of the Annapolis Centre of the Royal Canadian College of Organists. The Choir's Principal Organist will be Dr. Kim Tan-Fleck. Kim has sung with and accompanied the Archdiocesan Choir, she has been an active member of the Cathedral Parish, and effective September 1 she began her new role as Director of Music Ministry for St. Mary's Cathedral Basilica.

First Thursday/First Friday/First Saturday — In the Roman Catholic Tradition, we have in our Church a way of intensifying what we believe in Faith about Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament (Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity) present in the Eucharist, We have a long tradition in our Church of many and varying devotions. All of these opportunities help us to grow deeper in our Faith and build a stronger relationship with God. On the First Thursday of the month, we are able to celebrate a votive Mass in honour of the Eternal High Priest, Jesus Christ/Holy Eucharist. The Church permits the use of particular prayers which help deepen the understanding of Jesus Christ, High Priest and help us be truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. On the *First Friday of the month*, we are able to celebrate a Mass in honour of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Remembering, from the side of Christ water and blood – signs of Baptism and Eucharist – the Sacrifice Christ made for you and me: that we would draw close to His Most Sacred Heart – be protected and guided, that our Hearts could be formed and one with His. On the *First Saturday of the month*, we are able to celebrate a votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This enables us to grow in a greater awareness of Mary, the Mother of God, entrusted by Jesus to his Beloved Disciple at the foot of the Cross and because of that, to us. We honor Mary for Christ her Son, we do not worship Mary, Mary will always guide us back to her Son Jesus – "Do whatever he tells you..." Through Mary to Jesus. Masses are offered on these days in our Parish. It would be great to see more people taking advantage of what is being offered for your benefit in Faith and for the glory and honor of God.

**Back to Ongoing Education** — We pray for all the young people returning to school, universities, colleges, and for the teachers and educators: that as they begin the year and venture into learning they may be blessed to grow in wisdom, and be prepared to use the knowledge attained for the betterment of society, of our world, our communities and our Churches. To our young people going off to university and college, we will miss you! Our prayer is that you connect with a Catholic Chaplaincy or local Catholic Church where you will reside. Keep your Faith in God strong. Rely on the growth of your relationship with the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, with Our Blessed Mother Mary and with the Saints. These will all help your success and good direction. Blessed Carlo Acutis pray for all our young people – quide them closer to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, enlighten their minds and hearts in God's unconditional love for them. AMEN
