

## 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - January 26, 2025

The Unity of the Body — the purpose of our Mission as connected to Christ's Mission, the anointing needed and the appointment given by Christ for each us to continue Christ's Mission of the Church. Today is Word of God Sunday. It is a day in which we can truly recognize through reflection on the Scriptural text that God does indeed send his Son, the Word made Flesh, into our world. Jesus Christ comes in time to a world most in need of his grace and redemption. Christ as the Word made Flesh gives us the Church as a means toward Salvation. Christ gives us the Church to guide us on our Pilgrim Way – to be a people peculiarly his own. The Church has a Mission. The Mission of the Church is begin to build the Kingdom of God here on earth. There is so much symbolism, there is so much mystery, that no one of us can contain everything. The joy is found in that together, as a Pilgrim People of Hope, the Church on earth, we can contribute to building the Kingdom of God. Happy Word of God Sunday!!!

**New Liturgical Season** — We are now in the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. The Church provides during the calendar year a particular vibrancy to the Church as she celebrates these days. Throughout the liturgical year, there are what we call Seasons in the Church. We begin usually early December with the first part of our calendar year called Advent, which moves into the Christmas Season. In January we start again Ordinary Time for a few weeks, until Lent. Forty Days of Lent leads us to the beautiful week we call Holy Week – where we celebrate the three Holy Days – the Triduum. With Easter Sunday we open a new Season called Easter Season, which takes us 50 days later to the celebration of Pentecost (Descent of the Holy Spirit). Following the Easter Season we resume Ordinary Time. The First two Sundays are major Feasts which are celebrated on a Sunday in Canada – Solemnity of the Holy Trinity and Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Ordinary time continues with many Feasts that are celebrated during the weekdays. The Church invites us to bring our lives to each and every liturgy with the hopes of receiving the graces necessary for the sanctification of everything we do. Let's Praise and Worship God with hearts renewed and set on serving him.

First Saturday of the Month — This coming Saturday, February 1, First Saturday Mass will be at St. Bernard at 9 am, followed by an hour of Adoration. Confession time will also be available.

#### Parish Centre at St. Rose of Lima Church

My name is Jim McAllister. I have been a member of St Rose of Lima since 2003. 10 to 14 years ago, I was chairman and then co-chair of a committee formed to build a Parish Centre here at St. Rose. That project and undertaking was stood down and halted by our Bishop at that time. The Diocese was in the process of a major restructuring, the outcome of which would and has impacted all parishes, including St. Rose. The concept of a church hall stopped but was not forgotten. Funds raised during that project remain held in Trust for an eventual hall.

It is now timely to recommence, with the support of our Pastor and Bishop, the eventual construction of a hall. We, being myself, our Pastor, the Parish Leadership Team and the beginning of a hall committee, have been gathering information on how best to approach the building and financing of the project. Some innovative thoughts are being explored around both design and financing which previously had not been considered. The building will not be as large or as expensive as in our former project.

We are communicating with you at this time to ensure you are kept informed as we inch the project forward. We will need some of you to assist in providing information and decision making. Our Parish and Fall River catchment area continues to enjoy substantial growth. It is important to participate in that growth and to build our parish through evangelization, church functions, programs and events. The rationale for our first attempt remains unchanged and is probably more critical today. With the revisioning and downsizing of the hall project and with the support of the Church leadership, this project is now doable.
