18th Sunday of Ordinary Time – August 4, 2024

Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life... What must we do to

perform the works of God? These two lines taken from John's Gospel for this Sunday contain tremendous focus for us. As we continue to reflect with the **Bread of Life discourse** in John's Gospel, we receive some truly important insights as we strive to discern what we are to do to remain faithful to doing what God wants – God's will, an obedience to His commands. The crowd in today's Gospel were starving for truth, the truth that the world cannot give. Jesus shares with the crowd and with us, Do not work for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life. The crowd came seeking that bread that endures, the crowd sought through Jesus and his disciples the better way. They wanted to do whatever it would take to grow in their faithfulness to God – they were to grow in believing in the one whom God sent. They would receive, because of the desire of their faith, the Bread of Life, Jesus himself. Let's pray for that desire, and let's ask God to increase that desire in each one of us to come to know, to love and to serve the one who will give us life eternal. Jesus reminds his disciples and the crowd ... I am the bread
